



Human Rights and Women Voilence

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The un charter looked for formalization of Human rights and culminated in the universal declaration on of Human Rights. Which were adopted by the General Assembly on 10th December 1948 subsequently various covenants, treaties and other declarations added additional strength to human rights. The un-development programmes human development report 2000 has complimented India for putting human development rights at the core of its development as the country moved up four notches to 128 to human development index this year. The constitution of India made provision related to fundamental rights of Indian citizen brought richness on the human rights. The purpose of this paper is to introduce human rights and woman violence in our country.

Here the question arises why there is violation of human rights of women. There seems to be multiplicity of factors like social, legal, economic, political etc. which act and react upon each other resulting into violation, subjugation, exploitation and discrimination against women one of major factors responsible for violence against women is the patriarchal nature of the family. The national Commission for women found that in uttarakhand region 30% of married women have been abandoned by their spouses for reasons such as in-

fertility or inability to bear male child. The times of India reported that in the year 2007 Delhi alone recorded 167 dowary deaths, 526 cases of rape, 832 cases of cruelty by husbands and in laws and 1649 cases of eve tea sing. Women in India are treated at their worst, hence crimes against women are very common and increasing continuously.

Suggestions for providing Human Rights and women voilence: The traditional social structure, cultural norms and value system continues to place. Indian women in disadvantageous situations in terms of relationships, decision making and sharing responsibilities. Their social, cultural, economic and legal status is still secondary which is the main cause of voilence of human rights. There is need to bring social revolution and social action. Second important strategy should be the empowerment of women by rising the ratio of women's education vocational training self employment schemes etc. improvement of status of women can be ensured only through their full integration and participation in task of national development with following plan.

1) Improve women's economic autonomy and well being. 2) Improve women's physical and psychological well being. 3) Reduce voilence in society against women and child. 4) Promote gender equality in cultural life. I think this is my opinion but I am sure that if every man in the society treats women as an equal human being and cares enough to see that she is provided every opportunity to enjoy and bloom with here human rights then there will be no voilence of humans (women) rights there will be no need of laws and courts. Here I reminded of some words of Swami Vivekanand which shows the reality of the existence of the world, "There is no chance for the welfare of the world unless the condition of the women improves. It is not possible for a bird to fly on only one wing."
